Important Information Every Educator Should Know

Stand Strong For Education on November 6

We sometimes hear from members that the political engagement of NEA-NH makes them uncomfortable. They ask why are we so deeply involved in politics at times, and is that the best use of our time and resources.

To answer that question, I'd ask you to look around your classroom and try to name an activity or item in that room that the Legislature or voters do NOT have control over? The curriculum? Nope. Textbooks? Nope. The condition of the classroom? Nope. The level of technology? Nope. Supplies? Nope. All of these things are controlled by your the state legislature, your school board and a budget passed by voters.

Take a look at your paycheck. Who has the final say on how much you are paid and what benefits you and your family receive? Your local elected school board and voters decide how much we earn, and what doctors we can see.

The simple truth is, we'd love to not be involved in politics, but almost every part of our profession is controlled by politicians and voters.

Elections matter. Our students are counting on us to make a difference. The sooner we realize that the impact we can make in their lives rides on the outcome of every election, the sooner we become involved and even obsessed with getting the right people in office.

For the sake of our students and their parents, we need to be sure that the Governor's office returns to the hands of a champion of public education and working families, safeguarding the dream of a quality public education for every child in New Hampshire. Educating our students is the most important investment our society can make in our future. We need to elect leaders who will make public education a priority.

NEA-New Hampshire recommended candidates are pro-education, pro-educator, pro-student, and believe as we do that every child in NH deserves a great public school, and caring qualified educators. I urge you to support them. I ask that when you vote, don't go alone. Bring your family and friends and neighbors. Recommending a Candidate

Throughout this edition of the Educator you will find NEA-New Hampshire recommended candidates. Members often ask how these recommendations are made and what role they can play in the process.

The recommendation process used by NEA-New Hampshire has been in place for many years and has been used countless times to make recommendations in the past for federal, state and local offices. The Government Relations (GR) Committee is responsible for producing these recommendations and forwarding them to the Executive Board for approval and action. This process is not new and was not modified in any way for this election cycle.



NEA-NH recommended candidates made appearances during the annual Fall Instructional Conference in October, providing members a valuable opportunity to meet one-on-one with the candidates.

The GR Committee is a standing committee of the Executive Board, consisting of 15 to 20 members. Voting committee members include teachers, education support professionals and retired members appointed by the NEA-NH President and approved by the Executive Board. The nomination and approval process of Committee members takes place prior to June, traditionally well ahead of candidate announcements. NEA-NH staff members also attend GR Committee meetings but cannot vote on GR matters, including recommendations.

“As a member of NEA-New Hampshire, you are eligible to serve on the Government Relations Committee,” said Megan Tuttle, NEA-NH President. “Membership on the GR Committee is open to any active NEA-NH member. Just let me know you’d like to be on the committee and your name will be added for consideration.”

The GR Committee conducts candidate interviews, evaluates candidate’s positions in regards to education policy and forwards any recommendations to the Executive Board. It is up to the Executive Board to accept any recommendation and then act upon it, by announcing the recommendation, rejecting the recommendation, or voting to do nothing with the recommendation.

“This process is not a popularity contest or a method designed to survey our members to find who a majority of them support. It is designed to find out, face-to-face, where candidates stand on our issues, and then recommend to our members the candidate who the Committee believes would best serve our students, our members and public education,” said Tuttle. “The Committee does not look at issues beyond public education and public sector collective bargaining rights.”

NEA-NH is the largest association of public employees in the state. “Our recommendation does indeed have worth to a candidate, but more importantly, our ability to sit with each candidate, ask questions and report back to our members is even more

valuable. We believe this process allows us to look beyond stump speeches and commercials, and more deeply into the candidate’s position on our issues,” said Tuttle.

In evaluating each candidate, the Committee reviews their responses and their voting record. The committee is looking for past support of public education funding and policies, support of collective bargaining rights, and protection of retirement security for educators.

The Committee reviews the candidate’s proposed new policies and solutions, not just in terms of their agreement with our positions, but also their likelihood of successful passage and implementation. The right words without a feasible implementation plan is a hollow promise in the eyes of the Committee.

Lastly, the Committee accesses each candidate’s electability. Winning a statewide or national campaign takes a great deal of resources, organization and support, and the Committee evaluates each candidate’s campaign for strength and longevity.

“The president of the United States and governor often serve as a “goalkeeper” for educators and students, working to balance, and veto if necessary, the products of less-friendly legislatures and Congress,” said Tuttle. “Electability becomes critical in cases such as these, since having no one in the executive office to protect the interests of public education and educators would be devastating.”

The Committee’s decision is not made public until presented to the Executive Board. The Executive Board acknowledges receipt of the Committee’s decision, then decides how to act on it. They can accept the decision and make it public immediately, opt to delay publication of the recommendation, reject the decision, or choose to do nothing.

A recommendation is the fullest and most complete level of support NEA-NH can give a candidate. NEA-New Hampshire does not endorse candidates. Instead we recommend them to our members.

“This entire process is governed by our bylaws,” said Tuttle. “As a member-led, representative organization, the recommendation process is open to review and change by our members during our annual Delegate Assembly. Proposed changes can be, and have been, introduced, debated, and decided during our annual meeting.”

NEA-NH maintains an Election Action Center on our webpage where information on recommended candidates, along with podcast with the candidates, a complete list of recommended candidates and information about voting locations can be found.

For the November 2018 Elections, the following questions were asked of all candidates seeking a recommendation from NEA-New Hampshire. Answers to these questions, along with any voting records and interviews were all considered when making recommendations for the upcoming elections.

Candidate Questionnaire

Have you ever been a member of the National Education Association, or any of its state affiliates?

Please answer the following questions in the spaces provided and/or use additional pieces of paper if necessary. Please try to keep your answers to each question to less than 150 words.

1. Briefly tell us about yourself and your background and why you are running for the Legislature. If elected, what experiences would influence your votes on education issues?
2. Do you support public sector collective bargaining? Do you support Right-to-Work legislation? Would you vote to place any restrictions on what can be negotiated in education contracts, how they are negotiated, or how they are approved or disapproved by the local union or public? Please explain your answer.
3. What do you perceive as the strengths and weaknesses of New Hampshire’s public schools, and how would you promote the strengths and correct the weaknesses?
4. What is your position on charter schools? If you support charter schools, how would you fund them?
5. Under the current retirement system an educator hired this year who retires in thirty years will have a pension of approximately \$25,000 a year that will never be adjusted for inflation. What changes can be made to the current system that will allow school districts to recruit and retain qualified educators by providing them a retirement upon which they can live when they leave the classroom? Please explain.
6. Do you believe the current New Hampshire School Funding Model provides for an adequate education for all students as required by the New Hampshire Constitution? Please explain.
7. Do you support public funds being used to pay for private education, religious education, or home schooling, whether through vouchers, tax credits, or any other funding scheme? Please explain.
8. NEA-New Hampshire members are approximately 75% female. Through their contracts they receive the same pay as their male counterparts. That is not true for many women across the country. What can be done to close the gender gap in pay for all women?
9. New Hampshire does not have teacher tenure. NEA-NH believes that non-performing teachers do not improve the profession or help students, yet all employees are entitled to due process when being terminated. New Hampshire’s five-year probationary period for teachers is the longest in New England and is often used to avoid due process and allow administrators to fire teachers without conducting substantive evaluations and giving the teachers a chance to improve. Would you favor a return to the pre-2010 three-year probationary period for new teachers?
10. With the events in Parkland, Florida, school violence has once again become a front-page issue. What can be done in New Hampshire to improve school safety and security so a similar incident never happens here?

Election Districts by Town and Ward

Each elective office represents the citizens of a district within the state. United States senators and the governor represent the entire state. There are two Congressional Districts, five Executive Council Districts, 24 state Senate Districts, and 81 districts for the New Hampshire House of Representatives.

To find your voting districts, look up your town of residence in the chart. Note that the state representative district numbers correspond to counties.

For example in Acworth, the first town listed, residents vote in the Second Congressional District, Second Executive Council District, Eighth State Senate District and Sullivan County Districts 7 and 11 for their representative to the New Hampshire House.

2017-18 Voting Record for NH House and Senate Members

Background on the bills and votes that impacted public education and educators last session

NEA and NEA-New Hampshire defend and improve the integrity of our profession by our legislative efforts in Concord and Washington. Attacks on education, opportunity and fairness are not ancient history – they happen every year, and last session was no different. Each year, NEA-New Hampshire provides a Voting Record to our members detailing each House and Senate member's vote on bills important to public school students and educators. Each bill included in this year's report card is described below:

HB297 - Repealing The Education Tax Credit Program. The education tax credit program allows businesses to deduct up to 85% of donations to the state's scholarship program, which is run by two separate non-profits. Scholarships go to students that attend private schools (including religious schools) or are home-schooled. **NEA-NH Position:** The education tax credit program should be repealed. **Result:** The bill failed 206-157.

SB11 - Prohibiting Collective Bargaining Agreements That Require Employees To Join Or Contribute To A Labor Union - also known as Right-to-Work. Unions are critically important in giving educators a voice that allows them to advocate to ensure every student has the opportunity to receive a good education that inspires natural curiosity and a desire to learn. **NEA-NH Position:** SB11 should not pass. **Result:** The bill was sent to indefinite study by a vote of 200-177.

SB8 - Relative To School Attendance In Towns With No Public Schools. SB 8 would allow districts to pay student tuition to private schools for the grades that the district does not serve on its own, permitting state dollars to go toward private schools, which, as a matter of policy, discriminate in their enrollment procedures against students with disabilities. Public schools are accountable for every dime, every penny of public money raised and appropriated. Private schools do not have the same transparency requirements. **NEA-NH position:** SB8 should not pass. **Result:** The House passed SB8 by a vote of 210-147, the Senate by a 14-9 vote, and was signed into law by the Governor.

HB144 - Making Appropriations For The Expenses Of Certain Departments Of The State For Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2018 and June 30, 2019. (The State Budget) **NEA-NH Position:** Well-resourced neighborhood public schools that are desirable places to be and to learn, that inspire students' natural curiosity, imagination and love of learning are what makes America strong by nurturing tomorrow's inventors, thinkers, artists, and leaders. Each year we will strive to assure funding decisions always keep what's best for our students at their core. The funding for public education was again inadequate and the budget as submitted should not pass. **Result:** The House passed the budget with a 198-169 vote, the Senate passed it with a 14-9 vote, and the Governor signed it into law.

SB191 - Establishing Keno And Relative To Funding For Kindergarten. This bill would make playing Keno legal in New Hampshire and provide that the profits from the game be used to offset full-day kindergarten for communities across the state. **NEA-NH Position:** We supported the bill since it provided funding for access to full-day kindergarten for all children in the state. We would prefer to see a more stable stream of income be used and look forward to working with future legislatures to establish such a source. **Result:** The House passed the bill 251-11, the Senate voted 15-8 in favor, and the Governor signed the bill into law.

HB1415 - Establishing A Death Benefit For A School Employee Killed In The Line Of Duty (and Making An Appropriation To The Public School Infrastructure Fund.) **NEA-NH Position:** The bill was introduced at the request of NEA-NH four years ago and we have been working to secure its passage ever since. Beyond being trained and expected to act in an emergency, New Hampshire educators will instinctively move to protect the children in their care, putting themselves in harm's way when the need arises. This level of dedication, caring and protection creates the need for this legislation. **Result:** The House passed the bill 176-161, the Senate approved the measure 14-10, and the Governor signed the bill into law.

HB1277 - Relative To The Renomination Of Teachers. This bill would have reduced from 5 to 3 consecutive years of teaching required for a teacher to be entitled to notification and a hearing where the teacher is not reappointed. **NEA-NH Position:** Under Speaker O'Brien, the Legislature needlessly increased the probationary period for new teachers from three to five years, stripping educators

of protections they have for decades and allowing administrators to non-renew teachers for ANY reason. This year's bill seeks to return the probationary period to the pre-O'Brien level and should be passed. New Hampshire now has the longest probationary period of any state in New England, making New Hampshire a less attractive state for new teachers. **Result:** The House killed the bill 170-151.

HB1756 - Relative To A One-Time Allowance For Certain State Retirees. The bill provides a one-time allowance of \$500 in 2019 to eligible retired members of the retirement system. **NEA-NH Position:** Retired educators deserve far more than this one-time payment, but we supported this provision as at least a step in the right direction. **Result:** The House narrowly passed the bill 163-157, the Senate passed it 13-11, and the Governor signed the bill into law.

HB 1405 and SB 102- Relative To The Eligibility Of School District Employees For Family And Medical Leave. This bill would have provided family and medical leave to school district employees who are not otherwise eligible for leave under the federal Family and Medical Leave Act. **NEA-NH Position:** NEA-NH proposed setting the eligibility level for hourly school employees at 900 hours in the previous 12 months. This would allow employees working 25 hours a week access to this important benefit. **Result:** The House killed the bill 169-162, the Senate also killed their version of the bill 14-9.

SB193 - Establishing School Vouchers Referred To As Education Freedom Savings Accounts For Students. This bill would establish a school voucher system in New Hampshire. **NEA-NH Position:** Regardless of what they're called; vouchers, education savings accounts, or tuition tax credits; these schemes all rob public schools of vital public funding and resources. Taxpayer money from hard working families across the state should not end up in the untraceable bank accounts of private schools. Instead of taking away funds from our public schools and handing them over to private schools, we should get serious about doing what works, and invest in neighborhood schools. NEA-New Hampshire will continue to work diligently to assure public money goes to public schools. **Result:** The Senate passed the voucher bill 14-9, but the House killed it 170-159 preventing vouchers from becoming law in New Hampshire.

SB357 - Amendment to Original Bill. This amendment would have given school boards the power to ban guns on school property. **NEA-NH Position:** We need solutions that will keep guns out of the hands of those who want to use them to massacre innocent children and educators. NEA-NH supported this measure. **Result:** The Senate rejected the bill 14-9.

HB1427 - Relative To The Reduction In The Calculation Of State Retirement System Annuities At Age 65. This bill would provide for the application of the reduction of a teacher retiree's annuity at the member's full retirement age under the federal Social Security system rather than at age 65. Currently the normal Social Security retirement age is 67 for anyone born in 1960 or later. For people born between 1938 and 1959, the normal retirement age varies from 65 years, 2 months, to 66 years, 10 months. For anyone born between 1943-1954, the normal retirement age is 66. **NEA-NH Position:** We supported this measure as it extends the well-earned full pension of our retirees up to two years more than it does now. **Result:** The bill was tabled after a 12-12 vote in the Senate.
